Update from Andrew Smart Chair of Competitions - As promised, I completed my deliberations around the six MMTs and 2 Vets MTs by last Friday 27th March and all the participating clubs have been informed of the results. The clubs in each merit table were given seven days to appeal my decision to Rob Park and a team of referees at the London. As my work finished, theirs has begun As, we are still in the appeal period, I am yet not in a position to confirm the Champions of each of our MTs or indeed those sides that have been relegated but I expect to be able to do that next week. I am conscious that we have a number of clubs that have teams in both the Surrey and HMMTs and also next week I will do an update on what has happened with them and their competitions.

My next step will be to speak to the clubs that have already reached county finals to see whether they would be interested in playing those games, assuming we will be playing rugby in September, before the beginning of next season. These finals include the main Cup, Federation Vase, MT Cup/Bowl/Vase, NW Floodlit Cup and H/M2 League Cup. Where clubs want these finals to be played, I will start to arrange dates and venues. Where one or both clubs don't want to play, the competition will be written off for the 2019/20 season

Finally, I have some ideas about revamping the three main county cup competitions, which have been in decline for some years, which would also see the inclusion of an extra competition, which I will share with you in a later newsletter. Lyndon and I would most interested in any comments once I have had a chance to properly explain them

Update from Andrew Smart Chair of Group Officers - Unsurprisingly along which much else that is going on throughout the county the Group AGMs in April have all been cancelled. However, the elections for the Group Officers will go on as planned. Clubs will be asked to select their officers after they have received nomination forms from their Group Secretary. All the elections will work to the date of the Group's nominated AGM. As it stands, I am delighted that seven of the eight Group Officers have agreed to stand again. Unfortunately, Brian East, Chair of the North Group, has decided to step down after many years of outstanding service and I am sure that I speak for all of us when I thank him for all his efforts. His common sense, his humour and his sense of calm will be sorely missed not only by the North Group, but us all and in particular all those across the county that he has done so much to help and inspire.

I am delighted that Jon Boyle the President of Hampstead has agreed to put his name forward to become the new North Group Chairman. It is of course completely a matter for the North Group Clubs but whoever does take Brian's place, he or she knows that they will have some big boots to fill. The dates for the group elections are as follows.
