After a couple of years in the adult game he was selected for The Middlesex County XV. This resulted in offers from three senior clubs, he settled on Saracens, and playing on the wing was top try scorer for the two seasons he was there.

After a spell at Wasps he returned to Finchley and brought with him many new ideas that transformed the way we played. Pat became a very successful Club Captain and established Finchley's long run in London 1.

When he retired from playing, Pat took up coaching, eventually becoming Head Coach and started the Mini Rugby section at Finchley.

For several years Pat ran the bar and clubhouse with his usual enthusiasm and a broad smile for everyone!

Funeral arrangements will follow but please free to pop along to Finchley this Saturday from 4pm when they will be celebrating Pat's life.

Welcome to the 2021-2022 season. I hope that your Pitch Up for Rugby weekends went well and good luck to those running them this coming weekend.

I'll apologise now, there is rather a lot to cover so this may be a rather long piece but all essential information.

We're back but do remember you can get all updated information from the <u>Club Support Centre</u> and Helpdesk FAQs.











Please do familiarise yourselves with the Age Grade tackle height law changes that come into effect at the start of the season for ALL age grades.

Middlesex are also participating in the U16-U18 tackle height evaluation, to help explore and better understand the important relationship between the actions of the tackler and the ball carriers. Clubs are asked to provide information from rugby match play injuries via on online portal, where parents and players can provide their consent to participate. Please do encourage our teams and players to participate in this trial. To request access to the CRISP registration portal please contact rfu-crisp@bath.ac.uk with club name and age group taking part.

We are also running some First Aid courses. Clubs are entitled to one place at the venue within their Group. If you have more than one volunteer that would benefit, please do let us know and we will add them to a reserve list. Please send the volunteer's name, club, position, email and RFU ID to loulatter@hotmail.com and andrewsmart@ntlworld.com. Dates and venues are:

## Message from Andy Smart, Chair of Competitions

So after just about 18 months rugby is definitely back. On Saturday we saw our first league fixtures at levels 5 and 6 across the county since March 2019 and I am able to report some middling success for our clubs with three wins and three losses. The results perhaps less important than the fact that rugby is back in full both on and off the field. Still for our level 7 and 8 clubs this is their last weekend of preseason before they begin their league campaigns on the 18th September whilst for levels 9 and 10, they still have a little time, not beginning until 2nd October.

Notwithstanding action on the field as with any new season most of what I have to talk about concerns the administration of our game particularly around the management of Covid, covered in RFU regulation 22 and in particular Appendix 1. This details the responsibilities of clubs should covid become a factor in a game going down. Regulation 22.pdf (englandrugby.com)

Part of the reporting conditions if that should happen is the completion of the Covid Declaration Covid 19 Declaration.pdf Form, (englandrugby.com) which has to be signed by four different club officials prior to submission. Once again, I encourage you to make sure you are fully conversant with both Appendix1 and the Declaration Form. I suspect that Covid will remain a significant factor for us all across this season. Indeed, at the weekend we already had one game gone down at level 6 in the SW Division because of Covid with none of the protocols followed by the affected club. This matter now sits on the desk of David Barnes the head of discipline for the RFU to be dealt with.

One of the big changes this season deals with what happens to clubs who withdraw from the leagues. In any normal season any club that drops of the league at any time in the season is automatically placed at the bottom of the leagues when and if it applies to re-enter. However, in this season the RFU have given special dispensation so that any club that does withdraw provided they complete the Covid Declaration Form, evidencing the impact of covid on their decision will be placed at the bottom of their league rather than removed in the normal way and will be relegated at the end of this season. What happens if you are at levels 5, 6 and 7 where there is no relegation and you do withdraw is a question that still needs to eb addressed. So far two clubs across London, Heyward's Heath in L1S and Stevenage Town in L3NW have withdrawn before their seasons have even started and whilst we all hope for the best, they perhaps will not be the only ones. Interestingly neither has taken advantage of the declaration. Both have been withdrawn from the league tables and both will be playing their rugby in their CB merit tables.

All sorts of issues this week with the Electronic Match Cards which no longer recognises players on your clubs registered players list unless they have been assigned to your 1stxv squad. The instructions came out in last week's Community Game Update if you still have it otherwise this is the link to the article and instructions

## A couple more things

Regulation 13.2.6 and 7 deals with promotion and relegation this season which has to be understood in the context of the restructure of the leagues and the introduction of lower xvs av levels 7 and below from the 2022/23 season. Briefly as I have already said at levels 5, 6 and 7 there is no relegation. At 8













and below decisions about how many clubs are relegated will be made at the end of season.

At levels 5 two teams from each league will be promoted

At level 6 that goes up to three

At level 7 three will be promoted from every 12 or 13 team league and four from a 14-team league At level 8 only the champion club is guaranteed promotion although that might increase at the end of the season

At 9 and below. No-one is guaranteed promotion although that will hopefully change as above

Finally, I am currently conducting a consultation via the league secretaries of the clubs in H/M1 and H/M2 about the introduction of the Game On Principles into their leagues, as per regulation 13 Appendix 2, 6&7. In brief there are six separate elements to the principles and clubs can agree to play one, some or all of them. The consultation is being conducted on the understanding that even if the majority of clubs in the league vote to introduce Game On into their competition, agreeing to play under the principles must be made on a game-bygame basis. If both teams cannot agree the match will proceed without the application of Game On. Where clubs agree to play a match under Game On the result will stand for the purposes of leagues points.

Clubs have been asked to respond by Sunday 12th September. The majority decision will count and clubs not voting will not be included in the result but will have to abide by the decision of the majority.

Still more to cover but that can wait for another day

Any questions on any of this please come back to me otherwise I will be attending all the September Group meetings and happy to take questions then.

## Update from Jok Dunbar, Chair of Representative Rugby

**Coaching -** We've gathered the Middlesex section coaches for an informal chat about past, present and future setup of the representational game for the county. We agreed we should be aiming to create an ethos and culture of pride for the Middlesex shirt, win, lose or draw it should be an honour to wear the colours and to play your best at any age group. We need to be fully aware that budgets will be more limited than ever, if at all, and we need to offer more than just smart training facilities and 'stash'. We can become more social and make it an event that players want to attend because of the friendships, level of play and mutual respect for each other.

Due to coaches moving out of the area, change of jobs etc we have lost a few personnel from the various sections, however we still have key people in each age group still keen to coach and a few new faces to add to the roster. We also agreed that the transition for players between each age group is an area we can really improve on and by helping across the sections the coaches will get to know players, more importantly the players will get to know coaches as they hopefully move up the age groups.

**U20's** - Whilst we await the outcome from the RFU regarding funding we are putting a plan B together. Should the funding be secured, and the representational calendar is to go ahead we will proceed as previous years but with a shorter programme with a section assessment, then simply a training session then game, training session then game etc If the funding is not given then we propose a smaller programme involving Hampshire, Berkshire in three fixtures involving all













three counties and split the costs between us. We will of course keep the costs to a minimum with pitch hire, physio & referee costs and team teas only.

There are more conversations being held with the girl's sections and hopefully we will be driving recruitment across the clubs. Grasshoppers have an excellent setup for girl's sections but even Leroy admits we need to build numbers in the other clubs offering girls rugby.

A vey informative and useful evening which was recorded and is on the County Website for anyone who wasn't able to get on the meeting.

Finally, can I remind Clubs about the Emergency First Aid in Rugby courses being held across the county. To be honest despite clubs telling us that this is exactly what they want, the take up at the moment is very disappointing. The need has been identified, the county is fully funding the course, the easy bit surely is letting us know who from your club will be coming. However, in case you missed the circulation or are still to action it, time is running out so I include a copy of the original message that came out both from the county office and via your Group

"The county will be fully funding forty-eight places on four Emergency First Aid in Rugby Union Course across the CB. Andy and I have taken the decision that each Group will host one course for 12 attendees on behalf of its own member clubs.

The course dates and venues are as follows

- NW Group Harrow RFC Saturday 18th September
- West Group Grasshoppers RFC Saturday 25th September
- South Group Chiswick RFC Sunday 26th September
- North Group Old Grammarians RFC Saturday 16th October











The course times will be from 9am until 5pm and places are limited to twelve.

To ensure that as many clubs as possible can access the course the intention is to limit attendance to one person per club and you can only attend the course for the group your club is in. If there is greater demand, we will seek more funding to support further course(s) and we will run a reserve list if courses are not full.
