The RFU will be running a Back in the Game Adult Male Recruitment Workshop webinar focusing on recruitment on 21st March at 7pm. To book at place use this link.

Our Mini's festivals have been running well and it's great to see so many kids playing rugby with smiles on their faces again. Well done to Teddington, Rosslyn Park, Ealing and Ruislip for their festivals. The final festival will be the U11s at Wasps FC on Sunday 20th March. We then shift our attention to the St George's Day Girls festival for U11, U13, U15 and U18s. The festival runs over two days on 23rd and 24th April at Wasps FC.

Clubs are asked to start getting their age grade players affiliated ahead of next season. This is a mandatory requirement (Regulation 15 15.1.4 and 15.1.5 but we are seeing low levels of age grade players affiliated across our clubs. Please also remember to get the correct tour approvals from the Middlesex County Office. More details on incoming and outgoing tours can be found on the England Rugby and Middlesex websites.

Planning is already underway for next season and I'm recruiting for new volunteers to join the Rugby Development. go flying up. Everyone want to play in a Final but even so that won't mask what a difficult season it continues to be for us all and the worries that I have for as we look to begin again in September

So, in the Championship, as Ealing Trailfinders begin their appeal to the RFU following the decision by the RFU to bar them and Doncaster Knights from promotion to the Gallagher Premiership for next season. I am sure that I speak for us all when I wish them every success. Anyway, with two matches to go and a game in hand they are currently two points behind Doncaster Knights. No change for London Scottish who continue to struggle. They remain bottom, with one game to go now nineteen points adrift of Nottingham.

At level 5 in the London and SE Premier League CS Stags 1863 who have appealed the decision to remove them for the league after they failed to honour their fifth game of the season away at Hertford had one of the best results of the season on Saturday gaining a losing bonus point at home to Westcombe Park. They however remain winless after twenty-two rounds now forty-one points adrift from the team above.

At level 6 in L1N Belsize Park remain ninth with Old Haberdashers tenth. However, in L1S London Welsh drop to second by nine points although with a game in hand over leaders Camberley. H&F remain fourth now 18 points outside the promotion places. London Cornish, remain bottom some ten points behind London Irish Wild Geese but with a game in hand

At level 7 with only two matches left in L2NW, congratulations to both HAC and Old Priorians who are already promoted. HAC are top by 8 points and require three more to be champions whilst Old Priorians are ahead of Letchworth on points difference. Outstanding season for both clubs who

will both be playing level 6 rugby next season. Old Streetonians remain fifth, Grasshoppers sixth, Ruislip eighth, Enfield Ignatians ninth, Hampstead tenth with Hackney now up to eleventh. In L2SW Chiswick drop to fifth with a game in hand and Twickenham tenth with two games in hand.

At level 8 in L3 Essex Epping Upper Clapton go up a place to ninth with two games in hand whilst in L3NW, Finchley remain top, one point ahead of Hendon in second with a game in hand, Finsbury Park seventh and Harrow eighth.

In Surrey One, Teddington drop to seventh whilst in Surrey Four Old Paulines remain second, Harlequin Amateurs third and Old Hamptonians fourth.

In H/M1 at level 9, with two rounds London Scottish Lions, who remain unbeaten are now top by ten points and require one more to be champions, Ealing Traifinders 1871 remain third, Wasps FC fourth Saracens Amateurs fifth Kilburn Cosmos sixth, Bank of England, seventh, Thamesians eighth and Actonians now bottom. In the H/M2 League Trophy Old Millhillians re top by four points over Brunel University, Uxbridge third. In the H/M2 Plate UCS are top, by three points over West London and four over Staines who both have a game. London French fifth and Mill Hill eleventh sixth

In the Allianz Premier XVs after sixteen rounds Saracens Women are top by thirteen points with Harlequins Women remain fourth and Wasps FC Ladies up to fifth. With only two rounds until the playoffs there is still much to play for.

No too much to say about the Lower XV Opt Out vote and the on-going discussions with Hertfordshire until we hear back definitively on their position. You would have seen the joint statement that was circulated to all the clubs in both CBs from both Chairs. Ultimately with our 91% vote to opt out we

cannot move on our position and it is for Hertfordshire to find a way forward that takes consideration about the majority view of their clubs. If they can, we can continue to play against their clubs in combined leagues. If not, then are options are drastically reduced

With the end of the season fast approaching here are some dates for your diaries. Leagues at level 7 and below finish on the 2nd of April for 5 and 6 on the 23rd April. The Merit Table Cup, Bowl and Vase finals will be played on Saturday 9th April (Venue(s) to be confirmed). The North West Middlesex Floodlit Cup Final will be at Ealing Trailfinders on Tuesday 19th April. The Six MT Plate/Playoff Finals will be at Ruislip on the 23rd April and if they are happy to take the Vets Cup as well it will also be at Ruislip. If not then it will be at the ground of one of the finalists.

Report from Chair of Groups, Andrew Smart

There is only one group meeting to report on since the February management meeting and that is the North West on 2nd March at OMTs. Nineteen of us in attendance it was great to get back to in-person but on top of that I thought that it was a tremendous meeting and an excellent example of how effective the groups are when they work well. Yes of course, it was great to back with our friends and peers and talk some rugby, yes there were the normal reports and club updates, which are so important for us in gauging the strength of our clubs and what is required to support them but there were some really excellent contributions from the floor. In particular Jatin Radia, the Ruislip Chairman raised the issue of entry fees for the County Festivals which he believes are too high. Quite reasonably he wanted an explanation of how the £95- fee had been

reached and what was the rationale behind the figure. This produced quite a lively discussion which ended with Eddie, Peter and I assuring the group that we would raise this issue at this management meeting and report back. Peter Hudspeth the Pinner President then followed up with an excellent email reinforcing the points raised by Jatin, which included the following.

"As a small club, every season our Junior Chairman has to make really tough decisions about which festivals they can and are unable to enter, due to the high costs involved. This is quite sad, as it goes against the ethos of getting the young players to play as many games as possible. The other problem that we have as a small club, is that we have to pay the entrance money in advance. Sometimes, for various reasons, we're unable to raise a team on the day. Unfortunately, no refunds are given! I do hope this issue is looked at seriously."

Without going on to discuss the particular issue, this is precisely what the groups are there for. Yes, they are there for the CB to ensure that clubs are kept fully up to date with the issues that they need to know about, to allow our clubs the opportunity to hold the management committee directly to account when necessary but perhaps more importantly to make sure that our clubs can raise their concerns direct to the management committee and be confident of some action

Interestingly, I had done some provisional work before the management meeting on this with some local CBs. Surrey for instance allow the host club to charge £50- per team which includes a small payment back to the CB. Hertfordshire allow their host clubs to charge the entry fees for their festivals with £50- per team for their U9 and U10 festivals raising to £70- for their U11s. I am happy to approach the other five London CBs to see what they charge if required but I think the comparisons with those two CBs alone with our own fees are pretty damming and coupled with the idea that some of our clubs cannot afford to enter their teams into our festivals because of the costs should already tell all we need to know.

Finally, the next round of Group meetings across April will include their AGMs. Unfortunately, Sean Burke, the North Group Secretary is starting a new business and will be stepping down from his role. It is a great shame. He has done an excellent job for his clubs and his relationship with the North Group Chair Jon Boyle in developing their Group could only have got better for the benefit of all. He is someone who has much still to contribute and we will need to find a way to bring him back in some capacity when he feels he has the time. Its great news that there have already been a couple of excellent candidates who have put themselves forward to cover his position so whatever happens the North Group will remain in good hands
