Update from Lou Latter - Chair of Rugby Development

Whilst the pandemic is now behind us, we are facing a new challenge of heatwaves and what this means for our pitches, and ultimately our player safety. We will keep pushing out communications on any guidance that comes out and I know Andy is keeping a close eye on things on how this affects the adult competitions. Please do reach out if you need

additional help or support while we wait for some rainfall. We will touch on this at the All Groups meeting on Monday 22nd August when we talk you through the new adult competition Regulation 6 (this covers both men's and women's competitions)

For all Age Grade teams please ensure you read the updated Regulation 15 and appendices. There is new playing up and playing down information. Now is the time to be getting your age grade parents and players working on reaffiliating for the season. You can find information and Affiliation FAQs on the Help Portal. Parents/Guardians will need to renew their child's affiliation by logging onto their GMS profile and re-affiliating to their club. For those new to affiliation, they will need to create a login to affiliate their player(s) to the club. A full guide can be found here.

As a reminder to clubs and Safeguarding Officers, DBS certification for all those involved in the age grade game and vulnerable adults should be checked and updated if required ahead of the season starting.

Age Grade Summer Framework Update - You will also have seen in the Community Game Update this week the Summer Framework Update for August. With more age grade rugby starting to take place this month, anything you can do to help people see and understand how far they can go to this month, before the season starts in September would be great. The 2022/2023 season sees the new Girls Age bandings come into effect, moving to U12, U14, U16 and U18. The new age bandings will automatically













be updated in GMS to assist with the affiliation process. Please do double-check dates of birth are correct. As a reminder, there is NO playing up in girls age bandings and this will be the same with the new age bandings. Playing players out of age bandings is a breach of regulations and does have discipline repercussions. The Middlesex Girls Fixtures have all been sent out to club contacts for each age group. The scheduled webinar on 30th August has been moved to Monday 12th September so please do let me know if you have not received an invitation.

For new committee members or those that would like a refresher, we will be running a 'Rugby Landscape' webinar on Thursday 8th September. This will cover off the role of the RFU, Council and Middlesex. This is a really useful session for you to understand the support that is available to you. Watch out for zoom details to follow in the next few weeks. Please do let me know if you wish to attend or have committee members who would like to attend.

The London Referee's Society is running a Women and Girls only Referee course at Wasps FC in Action on Wednesday 14th September from 7pm - 9.30pm. Cost is £10 per person (subsidised by LSRFUR from £25). Register for your place here.

Applications are now open for the RFU Rugby Leadership Network. This will be the London and South East Network as Middlesex will run a specific Middlesex Rugby Leadership Network in the 2023-2024 season if there is appetite. This is a great leadership programme for new and aspiring committee members to participate in for rugby and personal development.

And finally, we are just finalising the Middlesex Hardship Grant programme for the 2022-2023 season. This will again provide financial assistance

to those families that need a little helping hand with membership and club kit costs.

Message from Andrew Smart, Chair of Competitions

By the time you read this you will hopefully have seen the circulation from the RFU Competitions Sub-Committee which met on Monday 15th August 2022 providing the protocols clubs will have to adhere to if they decide against starting their season on the 3rd September either because of unfit pitches or because of the unpreparedness of players to play. I understand that the London DOC intends to meet on Thursday to decide how to respond and to determine whether the RFU has gone far enough. I wasn't at the meeting and as I write this report, I haven't seen the protocols, however as it stands it is my belief that this is a totally inadequate response and a cop out by the committee

In order to support the DOC as it made application for a delay to the start of the season, I sent out the following message to the league clubs across Middlesex and Hertfordshire via their league secretaries.

"Anyway, before next Monday's RFU Competitions meeting I wonder if each club could give me an update on your pitches and where you see you are at the moment in relation to being able to start on the 3rd September. I would be interested to

know what sort of training you are able to do with special reference to player safety including any injuries you have picked up that you believe could be put down to the hardness of your pitches. I appreciate that some of you have AGPs and others might have been able to get water to your pitches. I would nevertheless like to hear from you all. I am looking to provide as much evidence from clubs to support the DOC at the RFU meeting on Monday evening"

I received 31 responses in three days which was pleasing. However, what was clear is that whilst there are clubs either with AGPs or who have had the ability to water their pitches there are considerably more clubs whose pitches are unplayable and dangerous. These clubs have reported that their players have been unable to train safely, have had no contact or tackling, been unable to play or host pre-season friendlies and are unprepared for competitive contact rugby. It is inconceivable to me that even if by some miracle pitches are playable in just over two week it is safe or fair to make players play league rugby when so many are clearly unprepared. I hope that London continues to make the case that the Division is not ready to play league rugby and that might be for considerably more than simply one week. For me as is likely a significant number of games do go down then all the game should be postponed. It will chaos if some games are played and hundreds are not and what happens to those clubs who can't host on the 3rd September when they are due to play away the following week on pitches that are still not safe.

I have a copy of the comments that clubs made in response to my circulation which I served on the London DOC before Monday evening's meeting and am happy to circulate to anyone that is interested

Coaching & Refereeing Update, Bob Lawless

What's On in the Coaching & Refereeing **Development World in Middlesex**

Interested in gaining a Coaching Qualification?

- Middlesex are inviting member clubs to nominate Senior players who would like support in achieving, The England Rugby Coaching Award (this replaces the old L2 award, which is now more commonly known as the ERCA)
- The programme is free and is open to all who have an interest in coaching in the Senior game. Middlesex currently run a support coach development programme for youth coaches, which includes mentoring support and those interested youth coaches can apply separately.
- The interested persons would have support throughout this season long programme and would have access to development programmes involving session design, coaching philosophy, CPDs involving, skill development individual and unit skills. Information on the relevant RFU regulations would form part of a programme involving on line learning and face2face sessions.













- The design of this programme would allow candidates to continue playing while obtaining this coaching award, a number of the sessions will be duplicated to allow flexibility on availability.
- The funding for this programme is a joint venture between the RFU & Middlesex County and access to all information is free and just require the commitment to see through the season long course
- There will be no interviews and on application there will be a follow up call and those interested in the programme will have a group on line meeting to fully discuss the programme with Q&A

Referee Development

In addition to Middlesex running regular Referees Webinars, the following referees' courses are available.

Take up The Whistle Courses. Theses short courses are a nice introduction to assist interested persons becoming a referee. The idea is to have enough trained up local referees to referee in their own club and clubs in close proximity. Those interested if they wish can go on to achieve the England Refereeing Award (ERA). On completion of the 2-evening classroom / on pitch course each person completing the course will be presented with a whistle, Lanyard and a Middlesex Referees Jersey.

Take Up the Whistle Courses

- Middlesex are looking to hold 5 Take up the Whistle Courses which will be spread amongst the groups
- The Courses will be run in clubs throughout Middlesex. There is a mixture of internal theory and external practical work. The sessions generally run from 19.00hrs -21.30hrs over 2 evenings
- The next Referee courses will take place in 3rd & 10th October 22, And further information on the dates & Venues for courses in November, January, February and April will be published in the Middlesex Newsletters.

Young Referee Match Officials Award

- This award is open to all youth players between U15s - U18s
- The purpose of the award is for Young Match Officials to help, when possible, in
