# **Update from Lou Latter - Chair of Rugby Development**

Happy New Year to you all (hopefully it's not too late to say that now we are mid-January?).

The Honda Volunteer of the Year nominations are now open and deadline for entries is 5pm on Friday 24th February. Please do get nominating your club volunteers. All nominees from Middlesex clubs will be invited to our awards evening at Twickenham Stadium on Friday 7th July, where we will announce the overall volunteer winners and club winners.

Please remember to look at the facilities funding available as part of the Rugby World Cup 2025 Impact Facility Fund. There are two opportunities for clubs to apply before the closing deadline of 31st January 2023.

- Sanitary Provision Package clubs can apply to receive sanitary packages from the RFU for their toilets and changing rooms. The value of these packages will be dependent on the existing toilet and sanitary provision at each club but will be approximately £1,000 and include wall mounted sanitary product dispensers, sanitary bins, stock refill packages of period products and innovative items to enhance your female facilities.
- Toilet Upgrade Grant Grants of £5,000 will be awarded to clubs to upgrade their female toilet provision. This can include creation of new toilets or the refurbishment of existing facilities.

Sport England have also relaunched the Sport England Small Grants programme. The grant has a maximum potential grant of £15,000 and any application should have planning consent or landlord's consent submitted with the application and the project be ready to start within 6 weeks of the award date. Closing date is 30th June 2023.

As we head into the final months of the season, we will see the Middlesex Mini's festivals take place at clubs across the county. Please do get the dates in your diary.

# Message from Andrew Smart, Chair of Competitions

The Christmas break has allowed me to do some analysis around where our clubs currently are, what their commitments are for the rest of the league season and to start some work on some options for our Counties leagues for the 2023/24 which I will be circulating to clubs later this week for consultation. As we know the last two rounds of league matches before the Christmas break were devastated by the weather, with 34% of matches only being played on the 10<sup>th</sup> December, dropping to just below 8% the following weekend. Added to the fixtures lost at the beginning of the season because of the drought and the lack of flexibility in the season we now have six Middlesex Clubs now playing on the 18th March which is the last break













weekend before the National Cup Competition starts the following weekend. As it stands, we have twenty-one Middlesex Clubs now playing on the 4th February, twelve playing on the 25th February, of which ten will also have played on the 4th February, and finally seven on the 18th March. Of those four clubs, Teddington, Hackney, HAC and now Hampstead, who also need to play on both the 4th and 25th February (eleven consecutive weekends of league rugby) and of those four, three apart from Hampstead have also entered the national cup competition with up to another six consecutive matches depending on how far they get in their competition. There is no doubt that this fixture congestion will continue to put a severe strain on our clubs with the resultant pressure on our faltering merit tables. Although very wet we got nearly two full league programmes since the league programme re-started on the 7th January gone but should the bad weather continue in early 2023 and fixtures continue to go down, we are very close to being in a situation, with the pressure from the start of the National Cup competition, the lack of flexibility of the structured season, where some clubs will not be able to complete their league season.

Interesting the completion rate for our three counties leagues ranked nationally (out of 102 leagues) as of the 22<sup>nd</sup> December are as follows

Counties 1 H/M 23rd 97.3% Counties 2 H/M 87th 75.3% Counties 3 H/M 95th 71.4%

Not great reading I'm afraid for two out of the three leagues although there were 100% competition rates across both Counties 2 and 3 H/M since the New Year which should see their percentage rates improve.

There has a raft of work completed by the RFU Competitions Task and Finish Group looking at the leagues and structured season for 2023/24. They have maintained that everything is on the table and they intend to have decided on their position about the way forward by around the 8th February. However, from what I have been have been hearing the best that can be said is that apart from tinkering around the edges the basic premise will remain the same with the league season due to start on the first week on September, ending in the second week of March and with the Papa John's Cup dominating the last six weeks, with little or no consideration about the World Cup running from the 9th September until the 28th October which for some reason they believe will have little impact on the league programme. Absolutely extraordinary. There is nothing we can do about the Regionals Leagues. They are regional and under the control ultimately of the RFU. The Counties leagues are a different proposition albeit we need to work with our partners in Hertfordshire. However, I believe that if what I am being told is ultimately correct that is not good enough for us and if we continue as we have this season, we will continue to see our clubs and game under significant strain locally with a further significant downturn on participation. We have I believe no other option the in conjunction with the clubs start making some decisions about the future of our leagues and the clubs that play in them for next season. I don't trust the RFU Competitions Sub-Committee to get it right for us. I very much hope that what they produce in February proves me wrong but I fear that another season of doing what we are now will see our game locally continue to fail.

Anyway, this week I am taking the first steps by preparing a paper looking at a number of different options for our three Counties leagues for next season. The idea is to provide three options which will first go out to the first to our DOC representatives Bob Lawless for Middlesex and David Toon for Hertfordshire and also the league secretaries for the three Herts/Middx Counties leagues before sending out to the clubs for consultation I expect to get something out to our clubs across Middlesex and Hertfordshire in the next couple of weeks and will be an agenda point at the four Group Meetings which start on the 23rd January.

Finally, onto the rugby and how are clubs are doing

In the Championship Ealing Trailfinders after thrashing top of the table Jersey just before Christmas then had a horrendous loss at second bottom Caldy. Still a try bonus point victory on Saturday sees them top by five clear points. Unfortunately, London Scottish continues to struggle, bottom and now eight points adrift.

At level 5, in Regional 1 Central, London Welsh, continue to improve and move up two places to sixth. In their sister league Regional 1 South-East CS Stags 1863 are currently going in the wrong direction and have fallen two places to ninth albeit with a six-point cushion from the relegation places

In Regional 2 Anglia HAC move up to third with a game in hand over the top side in the league and two over the club in second place. In Regional 2 Thames Hammersmith and Fulham, remain top now by twelve points with thirteen over third placed Old Priorians. Belsize Park jump two places to seventh. London Cornish drop to eight with Old Haberdashers moving up to tenth and out of a relegation position after their home win to Cornish on Saturday.

At level 7 in Counties 1 Essex, Epping Upper Clapton go up a place to ninth. In Counties 1 Herts/Middx Grasshoppers drop to second behind Hemel Hampstead with the same number of points but the Herts recording one more victory sees them at the top of the table. Chiswick remain third, Old Streetonians fourth. Finchley seventh, Hampstead remain eighth, Ruislip up to eighth. Hampstead drop one place to ninth, Enfield Ignatians eleventh one point off the team above them and a game in hand and Hackney with two games in hand remain bottom. In Counties 1 Surrey/Sussex Twickenham remain fifth but with two games in hand

At level 8, in Counties 2 Surrey, Teddington continue their brilliant season, still unbeaten, top by seven points and with a game in hand points whilst at the other end of the table London Exiles continue to struggle but recorded an excellent win against mid table opposition on Saturday remain bottom. In Counties 2 Herts/Middx Ealing Trailfinders 1871 remain second by two points from Cheshunt who

have a game in hand., eight points ahead of London Scottish Lions who have two games in hand. Saracens Amateurs remain fourth also with two games in hand, Hendon up to fifth, Wasps FC drop to sixth whilst Harrow remain eleventh and bottom following the withdrawal of Finsbury Park

In Counties 3 Herts/Middx Brunel University who remain unbeaten are top by fifteen points. Old Millhillians up to second with two games in hand, Bank Lane remain fourth, Thamesians up to fifth UCS drop to sixth Kilburn up to eighth, Actonians drop to ninth and Uxbridge remain tenth. Much still to play for all these clubs with only Brunel and Thamesians having played the full number of games before the league splits in phase two

At level ten in Surrey 4, Old Paulines remain second with Harlequin Amateurs dropping a place to fourth.

At level 11 in Surrey 5, Old Hamptonians remain top by two points but with a game in hand.

In the Allianz Premier XVs, Harlequins Women up to third after seven rounds, Saracens Women up to sixth but with a game in hand, Wasps Women remain ninth with no points only sitting above DMP Sale on points difference
