At this time of year many clubs think about going on tour both adults and youth. Whether you are an England international or a part time player for your local side, going on tour is a fantastic way to build team spirit, morale and identity. It provides a rare and exciting opportunity for players and coaches to get to know each other that little bit better and helps to establish a common style and purpose. Tours often provide memories and friendships that will last a lifetime; the camaraderie can be second to none.

When planning a tour, whether overseas or hosting a team from another country, clubs, teams, and schools (of any level or any age, male or female) need to obtain approval from your CB. If you're planning on touring with children and/or vulnerable adults it is essential that you read our [Touring with Children](#) Guide. If you are a school then please refer to the [schools page](#) of the RFU website.

Similarly, for those planning an Age Grade festival or tournament approval from the CB is needed before advertising your festival.

I hope you have all been enjoying the Women's 6Nations. The Red Roses have been dominant and now head to Twickenham on Saturday for a Grand Slam Decider against France. This will be a cracking game, the first ever standalone Red Roses fixture at Twickenham Stadium and a world record crowd with over 50,000 tickets already sold. If you haven't got your ticket, then you can still purchase [tickets](#).

All volunteers who were nominated for the Honda Volunteer of the Year Awards will soon be receiving their invitations to the event at Twickenham Stadium on 7th July. Club representatives will then receive their invites, as we try and get representatives from all clubs within Middlesex at the event to celebrate the great work our volunteers do each season.

With the new tackle height being introduced next season, and with the Age Grade season finishing on Monday 1st May 2023, clubs are reminded to check [Regulation 15 Age Grade Out of Season Activities Guide](#) for what you can and can't do with the different age groups over the off season.

The St George's Day Girls festival, in conjunction with Surrey CB and London Irish Amateurs will be held on Sunday 30th April at the London Irish Hazelwood ground. 76 teams have entered across the U12, U14, U16 and U18 age groups in what will be a great end of season festival for the girls. Please do try and get down and cheer on the girls if you can.

The RFU have introduced an Active Bystander training programme that helps continue building to a more inclusive game. This is an interactive 2-hour session and deals with all forms of unacceptable behaviour. This session is a core education module that is being rolled out to the game and I would

encourage all clubs to get the session booked in for players, coaches, volunteers and parents/spectators. I have attached the flyer for more information.

A couple of weeks off and then Steve and I will get together to see what we can do to support our competitions next season and make sure that those who want to play do.

Nevertheless, many congratulations to our cup winners and play-off winners and to all our clubs and teams who continue to support our competition. Tough season.

Following the meeting of the Herts and Middlesex Competitions Sub-Committee last week I sent out the following message to the 35 clubs who will make up our county's leagues for next season

"Following the Herts/Middx Competitions Sub-Committee meeting on Wednesday 19th April 2023 the applications of Stevenage, Finsbury Park and Berkhamsted to join the leagues for the 2023/24 season were approved

We can also now announce the results of the Consultation and with it the makeup of the three Counties Leagues for the 2023/24 season

Of the 35 clubs eligible to vote 33 recorded a vote, one club voted after the deadline and one club didn't vote

14 clubs voted for option 1, 3 for option 2, 2 for option 3 and 14 for option 4

As pre the instructions for the consultation as there was a tie, Andrew Smart and Simon Embleton abstained for the final decision about the make-up of the leagues for next season.

The remaining members of the committee decided that with no clear mandate for change and the leagues for the 2023/24 season would be as follows

Counties 1 H/M 12 teams playing home and away

Counties 2 H/M 12 teams playing home and away

Counties 3 H/M 11 teams playing home and away

At the moment unless there are changes to the format of the structured season following the review of the Papa John's Cup all three leagues will start on Saturday 2nd September

To be absolutely honest this is not what I expected. I cannot pretend that I am not disappointed in the result and genuinely believe that more of the same with everyone starting on the 2nd September is not in the best interests of our clubs. I now understand why the RFU only run "Consultations" where they have already determined the result. This however was a genuine consultation and whilst I may not like it and continue to struggle with the implications of the vote, decisions have been made and we have to get on with it. The only good news I guess is that the structured season next year will see the league campaign extended from the second week in March to include the first week in April

Nearly there but we still have some exciting rugby left. In the Vets Cup we will have a new name on the trophy with Old Priorians reversing last season's

final defeat to Chiswick in a superb semi final last Friday night under lights at Chiswick winning by 22 points to 17 to face Hampstead Vets who overcame Old Streetonians Vets by 43 to 19. The venue and date of the final still to be announced

We are also now at the Semi-Final Stages of the various Papa John's Community Cups with four Middlesex sides still in the competition with all fixtures due to be played this Saturday

At level 5 CS Stags 1863 travel to Launceston in the Regional 1 Plate semi-final. The final of this competition will be on Saturday 6th May at Sixways Stadium

At level 7 Twickenham host Weybridge Vandals in the Counties 1 South Plate semi-final. The final will be at Stonex Stadium on Saturday 6th May

At level 8 and Teddington host St Ives in the Counties 2 Championship semi-final. The final will be at Twickenham Stadium on Sunday 7th May

Also, at level 8 in Counties 2 South Plate Semi-Final Ealing Trailfinders 1871 travel to Chipstead. The final will be at Stonex Stadium on Saturday 6th May

So, if you are looking for some rugby this weekend you can do worse than support one of our Middlesex clubs as they continue their search for some silverware. All the best to all four clubs this weekend. I am sure that they will be grateful for your support. I for one will be going to Chipstead to cheers on Ealing Trailfinders 1871.

Report from Chair of Groups, Andrew Smart

With the North Group meeting at Grammarians on Monday night we have now completed all four Group AGMs and the final group meetings of the season. A couple of things of note that might be of interest

1. I believe that this is the first round of Group meetings that were all in person for the first time since the pandemic

I firmly believe that a mix of Zoom and in person meetings are the best way forward for the Groups but boy it has been great to catch up with people across the county, share a beer, a sandwich (or two) and a laugh (or two) with some great rugby people.

South at Old Paulines, West at Feltham, North West at Wasps and finally North at Grammarians

2. Once again, all eight group officers were voted back into office by their clubs

South - Chair Jerry Rogers (London Cornish), Secretary Lyndon Walters (H&F)

West - Chair Andy Brooks (O Isleworthians), Secretary Nick Dance, (Grasshoppers)

North-West - Chair Andrew Smart (Harrow), Secretary Mark Foster (OMTs)

North - Chair Jon Boyle (Hampstead), Secretary Debbie Stockman-Rose (o Grammarians)

On the one hand this can be seen as a ringing endorsement of their qualities, on the other hand a real issues around viable alternatives from our clubs who perhaps don't value the groups and what we do as much as we want. Probably a combination of both. However, there is definitely a succession issue and whilst our excellent Group Officers continue to make themselves available it is very likely that this position will not change. More likely the lack of people willing to volunteer for these roles mean that the current group officers are unable to step down. I know we have committed to a review and whilst this season with all its problems both locally and nationally have meant that we have not been able to follow through on this commitment I think that it has to be absolutely essential that Tim, Eddie and I get a grip of this across the close season. In the mean-time every Group Officer continues to do an excellent job on behalf of their clubs and groups and it would be remiss of me not to acknowledge that and thank them on behalf of their CB and its members for all that they do

Simon Hardcastle the Group Secretary will be conducting the lecture for the Group Chair for the 2023/24 season in the next couple of weeks.

By the beginning of next season, we expect to have a new voting club in Middlesex with Hanwell having just been endorsed by the CB Management Committee at our latest meeting and hopefully now onto RFU Governance for final validation. This has been initiated and driven by the County Secretary Tim Miller and it will be great to join another Middlesex Club through to full voting rights within the Union and with it access to International Tickets

Finally, a couple of dates for your diary that must not be missed

Friday 26th May is the deadline date for all voting clubs to ensure that all their matches from U14s upwards across the season are all on the GMS and resulted for them to receive their full benefit for international ticket allocation. For anyone who

might be struggling with the process, please contact me andrew-smart@ntlworld.com and I will be happy to assist

Friday 30th June is the deadline date for clubs to submit their “Payment of Player” Declaration against the following criteria

For clubs whose men’s first XV team play at **Counties Level 2** (formerly Level 8) **and below** the declaration is only required to be submitted if the club provides Material Benefits (as defined in Regulation 1) to players and/or engages a player coach.

Clubs at Counties Level 2 and below **DO NOT NEED** to submit a completed declaration if they **DO NOT provide** Material Benefits to players and /or a player/coach. These clubs will not lose access to RFU benefits.

If a club at Counties Level 2 or below does not submit any declaration and is later found to have paid Material Benefit to a player or a player coach, disciplinary sanctions will be considered.

As a reminder, the declaration covers the period of 1 June 2022 – 31 May 2023.

Regulation 7 (Payment of Players) can be found in full [here](#) providing further information on thresholds and definition of RFU benefits.

The entire process will be completed within GMS and requires the three nominated club officers to be able to log into GMS and approve the declaration. It is therefore important that each authorising club official has the most up to date email address listed against their account in GMS before starting the process.

- 17 Coaches are on the RFU Middlesex Targeted Funding England Rugby Coaching Award (ERCA) Course. Final day is on Sunday 2nd July 2023
- Middlesex to date have run 10 Coach education sessions, targeted at all levels of Middlesex Coaches, with 204 coaches attending.
- Tuesday, 18th April, Youth coaches of Twickenham RFC, attended an open coaching evening at Hazelwood DPP, to view what’s trending in youth skill development
- Wednesday, 19th April, Youth coaches of Hampstead RFC, attended an open coaching evening at Harrow School DPP, to view what’s trending in youth skill development.
- Summer programme for Middlesex young players & coaches, will take place in the summer months dates tbc in the May Newsletter. The sessions will take place in various locations throughout Middlesex and will cover Safety in building a successful scrummage and developing the lineout. These will be an excellent fit for Middlesex Youth coaches and will involve Middlesex Youth Players
- Sunday 9th July 2023, London Irish will be running a Coaching conference suitable for all levels of Middlesex coaches. The Coaching themes and tutors will be published in May

To all Middlesex Coaches interested in working their way towards the England Rugby Coaching Award (ERCA the Old Level 2)

Middlesex are looking to support Coaches who are interested in growing the Senior game by becoming an RFU qualified coach. Those who are interested in gaining a coaching qualification would be supported through the following syllabus –

- Gaining an understanding of the coaching pathway.
- Developing a coaching philosophy
- Structuring a coaching session.
- Attending relevant structured coach education sessions.
- Understanding, activate and strength & conditioning.
- To gain an understanding of Regulations 9, 15 & 21, especially young players transitioning into the senior game.
- To attend the RFU, GMS courses in preparation for attending the England Rugby Coaching Award (ERCA)
- To embrace the support of an RFU qualified mentor, to support each candidate through an agreed Personal Development Plan while working towards an RFU coaching qualification

This programme finished earlier this month after a twenty-week engagement with 40 girls taking part from various clubs across Middlesex. It did not take long for the girls to come together as group, and this made the coaching really enjoyable. Initially we tried to ensure that the sessions would move every five weeks around the county but sadly poor weather in November and December meant we had to settle at the wonderful facilities at Grasshoppers.

The session content was designed around improving core skills through small, sided games then working towards more technical aspects by position. The sessions were fun and well attended, and the girls really responded well to the coaching. we had the opportunity to play games against other counties and it was good to see how evenly matched the games were. Most importantly it was great to share best practices with the other counties and facilitate some great playing opportunities through true collaboration.

We have learnt a great deal after this inaugural season and will be making small tweaks to the programme for next season. Some of the girls that will be moving up to U17 will be given the opportunity to experience the Centre of Excellence over May and June with a trial and selection process taking part in July.

Thank you to the RFU for this great programme, thank you to our host clubs this season, Finchley, Ruislip and Grasshoppers and of course a huge

thank you to our coaches and physiotherapist for their time, planning and dedication. Lastly Thank you to the parents that enable your children to take part, the girls were coachable, respectful, hard working and a great deal of fun.
