A roundup of my presidential rugby travels in November:

I was warmly welcomed to Wasps v Tabard for their Counties 2 (Herts/Middx) league match and a lunch that was well attended by past playing legends and current supporters.

recall his late father, Reg who use to run touch for the Vandals (Wasps 2s) and ran the Harrow Referee Society in his later years; he encouraged me in my early refereeing days.

I was also able to briefly see some of London New **Zealand Kiwis 1s v HAC 2s** game on the next pitch. HAC won, 19-54 pts, although that scoreline didn't reflect the competitive nature of the match. I witnessed good play from both teams.

I watched Imperial College 2s v University of **Sussex 2s** in the BUCS' Southern Conference Cup at Imperial's Harlington ground. Imperial (IC) won 19-18 pts in a cracking match played at real pace and kept flowing by Greg Reed (LSRFUR). The standard of play was easily akin to league 7 or higher.

Age Grade registrations are now tracking in line with player numbers from last year. However, we still have some clubs that are well behind on age grade registrations. Please do reach out if you are struggling with getting parents to complete the registration process.

The Honda Volunteer of the Year nominations will open on January 8th so get thinking about those volunteers that have gone above and beyond and get nominating.

Message from Andrew Smart, Chair of **Competitions**

With rugby now finished before the Christmas break, the majority of our clubs are now over the halfway point in their league campaigns.

The biggest issue that we face going forward, are the postponements that have been generated by the dreadful weather over the last three weeks although we got a pretty full programme this weekend and a couple of postponed games in Counties 2 Herts/Middx who had a break weekend, played to take some pressure off the forty-eight games we have across the division still to be played













We currently have 39 clubs currently playing their rugby in the leagues at level 5 and below and eligible to enter the Papa John's Community Cup competition. There are three competitions at each level from Regional 1 down to Counties 2. There are still three competitions at Counties 3 and below, but instead of them being split at each level, the three levels are combined.

Anyway, entries are now closed with the draw to be announced following the completion of this weekend's round of matches with the clubs entered into the relevant competition at each level dependent on their league position after this round on matches. To ensure fairness where some clubs are still behind in their fixtures, either from postponements or perhaps playing in an odd sized league where they might have played less matches than some others the Best Playing Record (Best Points Percentage) will be used to calculate their "true position" in their league.

As it stands of our 39 league clubs at Regional 1 and below, we have twenty-six who have entered the competition. This is 66.6% of our clubs. At Regional 1 and 2, we have only four out nine, less than 50% of the clubs at those levels, leaving 22 out of 30 in the Counties competition.

Once the draw is all clubs will be given a two-week grace period to decide whether to honour their commitment to the competition or withdraw. Much I guess will depend on the expectations of each club and whether they get a home draw.

Anyway, a look now at how our clubs are faring as they begin a two week break before the leagues start again on the 6th January 2024.

In the Championship Ealing Trailfinders remain top by 2 points after seven rounds despite their loss last week at London Scottish, which lifted them off the bottom. The Ealing v Cornish Pirates match was stopped today at 62 minutes after a Pirates player was knocked unconscious in a tackle with Ealing leading 12-0. I suspect that the game will have to be re-played and of course we wish the very best to the young Pirates player who remains in hospital.

At level 5 in Regional 1 South, after twelve rounds, London Welsh have dropped to fifth, CS Stags 1863 remain at sixth and Hammersmith and Fulham drop to seventh, 10 points outside the relegation places.

At level 6, in Regional 2 SE, also after twelve rounds, London Cornish are now bottom six points from safety. In Regional 2 Thames, H.A.C remain second, undefeated but with two draws leaving them six points behind the leaders. Belsize Park up from third to second, HAC despite only one loss but including two draws drop to fourth, Old Priorians drop to sixth Grasshoppers, who had initially struggled have now won five of their last six and remain at seventh with Old Habs, up to eighth, Fullerians remain eleventh and in a relegation spot which is a worry. As I have said any Hertfordshire or Middlesex side that gets relegated from a level 6 league this season, into Counties 1 H/M, will create an extra relegation into the leagues below. That doesn't apply to London Cornish as they are on a permanent level transfer to Surrey and if relegated would drop into Counties 1 Surrey/Sussex.

At level 7, in Counties 1 Essex, after twelve rounds, Epping Upper Clapton are second. In Counties 1 H/M also after twelve rounds London Scottish are top by two points over Chiswick, Finchley remain fourth, Old Streetonians sixth with a game in hand, Ruislip drop to eighth, Hackney remain ninth, Enfield Ignatians drop to bottom whilst Hampstead after two victories in a row go up to eleventh. In Counties 1 Surrey/Sussex Teddington continue on from last season, undefeated after twelve rounds with maximum points and top by ten. Twickenham jump one place to fifth.

At level 8 in Counties 2 H/M after nine rounds (a ten-team league) Ealing Trailfinders despite their loss in a high-quality game to Brunel University remain top with Brunel still second but now only three pints behind. Old Millhillians up to third, Wasps FC drop to fourth whilst Harrow after











consecutive draws drop to sixth, Saracens Amateurs remain seventh, with Hendon bottom.

At level 9, in Counties 3 H/M its all change after eleven rounds. UCs up to second, Bank Lane with a game in hand drop to seventh, Finsbury Park drop to eighth (but are entering a 2nxv into our MTs after Christmas which after their travails of last season is hugely to their credit) Actonians remain ninth, Thamesians tenth, Kilburn Cosmos remain eleventh Uxbridge up to twelfth. In Counties 3 Surrey also after eleven rounds London Exiles go up one to eighth.

At level 10, in Counties 4 Surrey after nine rounds, Old Hamptonians are top by two points with Old Paulines down to fourth albeit with a game in hand, Harlequin Amateurs drop one place to sixth, whilst Staines go off the bottom to ninth.

At level 11 Counties 5 Surrey, after nine rounds, London French with a game in hand are up to third.

In the Allianz Premiership Women's Rugby after four rounds, Saracens Women are top undefeated with maximum points, Trailfinders Women, are sixth and Harlequins Women seventh.

Enjoy the break. It won't be long before it all starts again.

It just remains for me to wish you all, your families and friends a very Merry Christmas and all the best for 2024.

Coach Education

Since the last November Newsletter, Middlesex have run the following activities.

- (1) Coaches & volunteers update on Age Grade Regulations, run by RFU Age Grade & Education Manager, Mark Saltmarsh. This online session attracted 34 candidates.
- (2) A Scrum Half workshop was run at Hazelwood, which was attended by 62 coaches.

To date this season. Middlesex have run 7 Coach Education Sessions which have attracted 302 coaches. The clubs that have hosted the Coach Education Workshops are, Grasshoppers, Finchley, Hackney, Hampstead and Hazelwood.

More Coach education's sessions will be run in 2024 and advertised on the Middlesex Social Media Platforms and Newsletter

Referee Education

To date in the first half of the season There have been 2 Take up the Whistle courses run in Middlesex with 34 in attendance.

Future courses are being arranged for Old Grammarians, Harrow & Twickenham with 2 Young Match Official courses being arranged at Finchley and Hazelwood

This is the best way for clubs to train up your own Young Match Officials to officiate the age grade games on a Sunday.
