#### President's Corner

The County President, Nigel Orton shares his Middlesex travels and encounters:

31 Aug: My first visit of 2024-25 was to Hurlingham Park, Fulham for a double header Hammers' preseason friendly. My thanks to Hammersmith & Fulham's long-serving club chair, Terry Alleyne, Bhomdat Mahraj (vice chair), Lyndon Walters (fixture sec) and Laurel Dunne (social sec) for their warm welcome and kind hospitality. It was good to meet club captain Matt Jones and director of women's rugby Sophie Tauchert.

First action: Hammersmith & Fulham Ladies 1 v Battersea Ironside Ladies 1. Hammers play in the Championship 2 Southeast League (level 4). Ironside are in Championship 1 South, and this showed as Hammers spent much of their time bravely defending but conceding five tries, 0 - 32 pts. Sirri Ranes (10) was captain and Ben Selway was coach.

#### Message from Vice Chair, Bob Lawless

It was great to see a large turnout at the AGM this past Monday. The evening went very well with 3 new board members being elected from our Middlesex member clubs. Best wishes to Mark Coles (Uxbridge RFC), Director of Team Middlesex, Fred Cracknell (CS STAGS 1863) Director of Rugby Development and Andrew Walker (HAC) Director of Club Development. Thanks to our outgoing Directors Lou Latter, who for many years has developed our member clubs, the Age Grade Game, volunteers & the female game in Middlesex. We wish Lou well in driving the female game forward and her new work in Women's Rugby World Cup 2025. A big thank you also to Jok Dunbar, for steering the representative sides for the past 5 years and especially the challenging times through the Covid years. Jok is still involved in the Middlesex Girls game and the Boys U17s & U18s development programme.

Conor O'Shea our keynote speaker brought updates to us on the new Community Game Partnership, the emphases on player development through our schools, clubs & academies and gave reference to the young England talent progressing through the England U20s; many are already in the full England squad. The Q & As through the members, allowed Conor to update all on the challenges in recruitment in the Senior male Community game, plans for the women's game up to the World Cup in 2025 and how well the numbers are looking in the Age Grade Game. Conor also brought to the attention of the meeting, the many different opportunities that people have in all other sports and the need for our clubs to adapt to meet the challenges; by being diverse in all other health related sports & activities. He did however gingerly sidestep his way on his thoughts on who should captain the British Lions in Australia in 2025.

# **Update from Fred Cracknell - Chair of Rugby** Development (on the field)

Month one has flown by, capped with the AGM this week which was a great opportunity to hear some of the challenges faced by clubs and to meet the great and good of Middlesex rugby.

One of the blindingly obvious challenges faced by the county and the game is representation. There was one woman at the AGM outside of those who work with the county / RFU which even then brings the grand total to 3. So, what are we looking to do in Rugby Development to help drive change?

One of the strong legacies left by Lou was the fantastic work she did in growing the W&G game in the county. To keep up that momentum I am looking to build a team of volunteers to coordinate and drive junior girls' competitions, ensuring that the clubs have an opportunity to play rugby at the right level with consistency. Part of this will be to continue to grow and support the Emerald Cup. If this sounds like something you'd like to be part of, please do reach out, we're always looking for willing volunteers!

We're at an exciting point in time in the women's game with a Home World Cup next year. It's important that the girls' game in Middlesex has the right structure and support network around it to capitalize on the increased interest and likely influx of players following what we all hope is an England win. The next twelve months are about refining what we have and ensuring this is the case. If we can nail the grassroots girls' game and create the right pathways through the sport, this will inevitably feed through to the women's game in the county and ultimately, to the aims of Conor O'Shea our keynote speaker at the AGM, to the professional game and create the next generation of Red Roses in time. As always any suggestions or requirements from the Middlesex rugby community are more than welcome.

As I start my rounds of the clubs in Middlesex, the first two on my list are Haringey Rhinos and Hampstead, both of which happen to be chaired by women. I'm looking forward to talking to Helen and Debbie firstly about the fantastic work they're doing to grow the game (both boys/men and girls/women) at their clubs and how/where we can replicate what they're doing around the county, but also, how we make rugby administration more appealing to women and grow women's representation at the decision-making tables.

## Message from Andrew Smart, Chair of **Competitions**

Whilst there is lots to talk about competitions now the season has started, it is the Future Competition Structure Vote that will dominate this report and the All-Clubs Zoom meeting that will be held on Monday 30th September.

To cover off on some of the background, Middlesex along with eight other CBs who voted in 2022 not to allow Lower XVs into their leagues, following a FCS review this season will be asked to vote again. The nine people who made up the current review team, included me and Paul Astbury so Middlesex was very well represented. At the last vote Middlesex clubs who were eligible to vote, did so by nearly 92%, not to include lower XVs into our leagues. Surrey, where some of our club's play voted last time by 89% also not to include lower XVs whilst Essex where Epping Upper Clapton play their rugby voted by 73%. Now the vote can be triggered by either at least 10% of the Middlesex voting clubs asking for the vote or four clubs, depending on what is the greater or, indeed if the CB decide that it would be appropriate for a vote to be held. In this case it would have to be the 10% figure. However, I believe that it would be appropriate for us to conduct another vote to see if the position of Middlesex clubs has indeed changed and I also believe we have a responsibility to acknowledge the views of those four clubs who voted in favour in 2022 and allow them to make their case again to the other clubs at the September meeting. I therefore on













behalf of Middlesex will trigger that vote and there will be no requirement for our clubs to make any application to the County

Simply Lower XVs in a CB will not be allowed to play in leagues operated by that CB in the RFU leagues, if clubs vote a two-thirds majority (of those clubs voting) against the national policy

I will just go through the timetable before going on to raise some of the issues

Circulation to the Nine CBs of the Lower XV Entry process, the entry criteria for the 2025/26 season and some FAQs on Wednesday 18th September

Middlesex All-Clubs Meeting on Zoom Monday 30th September 7pm until 9pm

Middlesex to inform the FCS Implementation Group of our intention to hold a vote by the 3rd October

Voting opens online on Wednesday 9th October

Voting closes at Midday on Friday 25th October

CBs that conduct their own vote to notify the Competition Development Team at the RFU by 5pm on Friday 25th October

Entry Application Window for lower XVs wishing to join the RFU leagues will open on Wednesday 6th November and closes on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> November

CBs or ROCs will assess Lower XV applications against the entry criteria immediately after the deadline closes

The FCS Implementation Group (which Paul and I would expect to be a part of) will decide the positioning of successful lower XV applicants at Counties 1 and below against the finalised entry criteria and applications from CBs/ROCs

Clubs will be informed of the of the outcome of their application early in December.

That deals with the timetable. I expect as we did last time, Middlesex will run its own on-line process.

The question that clubs will be asked to vote is likely to remain the same as 2022...

"Do you support Lower XV teams from your CB playing in the English Clubs Championship (ECC) Yes/No"

To confirm that whilst this is a simple yes/no vote at least two thirds of those voting clubs who then take part in the vote must vote against the proposal for Lower XV to be disqualified from playing in our leagues

One of the issues we agreed during the review was that even if we stopped Lower XVs playing in our counties leagues it wouldn't stop clubs looking to enter teams in CBs leagues who did allow lower XVs to enter. That was a change from 2022 but seems at odds with the potential question above. I will seek clarity on that in good time for the 30th September meeting

Two full years after the implementation that allowed Lower XVs to enter those CBs leagues who hadn't voted out, (interestingly not one CB in 2022, actually voted to allow Lower XVs into their leagues; they just didn't reach the threshold required to keep them out) there is some data that the RFU believes support the success of the implementation. Now whether two seasons date is sufficient to draw any definitive conclusions is open to question. However, what is certain is the Rugby landscape has indeed changed with their inclusion and supports the desire for a new vote.

It is also important to understand exactly where Hertfordshire, who's clubs play in our combined CB leagues stand, as we go into vote. In 2022, their clubs voted by 64% to exclude Lower XVs but it didn't reach the 66% threshold required. Across Middlesex and Hertfordshire, the clubs voted by 81.4% to exclude Lower XVs but it was the individual CBs votes that counted and not the combined and it leaves us the mess we are still in today. I have had frequent conversation with Hertfordshire as we prepare for the vote, and they













have made it very clear that should Middlesex Clubs vote again to exclude Lower XVs from our combined leagues, they will go out on their own and set up their own leagues which, will include Lower XVs. It is important that we understand where they are on this but if that does happen, we will have to deal with it. It will allow those Middlesex clubs that wish to enter the Lower XVs into leagues, the opportunity to do so in a Hertfordshire League and should allow those Hertfordshire Clubs who wish to remain playing against 1st XV Middlesex Clubs, the opportunity to continue to do so. It is very important that we are absolutely transparent with our partners and friends from Hertfordshire, and I will share this document with them and they will be invited to attend our All-Clubs meeting so that they gauge the mood of the meeting and of course take the opportunity to explain their position to our clubs

I should also point out that should our position on Lower XVs entering our leagues changes after the vote, clubs must understand that there will have to be a re-organisation of our leagues from Counties 1 downwards that without doubt, would see enforced relegations to accommodate the inclusion of Lower XVs at that level and below on top of the normal number of clubs to be relegated at the end of next season. Simply Lower XVs will be allowed to enter the leagues up to Counties 1 Level dependant on the levels that ROCs and CBs decide is appropriate to their strength. Every Lower XV entered at level 7 will see an additional relegation from that league which will cascade downwards. Each Lower XVs entered at Counties 2 will see a further relegation from that league plus the extra relegations coming down from Counties 1 and so on. Allowing Lower XVs into our combined leagues will almost definitely see at least one new Counties League across Middlesex and Herts which would be great news. At the same time clubs must understand all the issues when they come to vote and the potential repercussions whichever way they go

Any changes will be effective for the 2025/26.

### **Update from Chair of Team Middlesex - Mark** Coles

I hope this finds you all well and your respective club seasons have started positively and you're enjoying the buzz of being back playing/coaching/supporting one of our clubs.

As I continue getting up to speed on my role, I really want Team Middlesex to centre around one phrase: "Giving our best players and coaches the best experience".

Representative Rugby is something unique and I feel bringing these three together will allow us to offer an experience to players and coaches that will serve them well wherever they may go onto in the future.

With the above mantra in mind, we have now kicked off activity in the Age Grade sections with the first U16 Foundation (formerly the Girls ERDPP) taster session held at Grasshoppers on the 8th of September with over 70 girls nominated this year - both new and returning faces with the coaching team lead by Nash Cohen, impressed with the skills on display. This is a broad programme that covers training and off field personal development and something the RFU have adapted in other areas. Similarly, the U18G girls and U17B programme assessment days are coming up in October and we have already received a healthy number of nominations from clubs.

As a County we'll be looking to strengthen our links with Harlequins and Saracens over the season now the map has been redrawn on what localities line into where, and we can keep building out these pathways.

One team we are looking to bring back is the U20's men which is now (subject to RFU Council ratification next week) subject to simpler eligibility criteria and further details will be shared on with clubs as we get them.

To close and as a call to action, whilst we have an established coaching roster in two teams, we will be looking for coaches will be in heading up the U20's and Women's programme. Role descriptions will be created shortly and shared and any relevant applicants are encouraged to apply. If you would be interested or know someone who may, please do let me know, or flag to them, that more details will be circulated. Bringing new blood and ideas is no bad thing so I am keen to foster an open process and find coaches who support the ethos of what we are doing.
