Message from Steve Partridge, Chair of **Competitions**

This is my first report as Chair of Competitions. Some enormous shoes to fill, Andrew Smart has been a great mentor, supporter, and friend to me over the last 10 years and has set me up well to take over, ensuring Competitions continues to deliver rugby to our clubs, considering we are now completely stand-alone, having broken away from our long-term partners Hertfordshire. I wish him all the best as he takes over as County president from Nigel Orton. Here is how our clubs are faring in their respective leagues. London Welsh is currently at the bottom of National League 2 East, having played 7 games with 1 win and 6 losses. In Regional 1 South central CS Stags are sitting in 3rd place with 22

points, having won 4 games and lost 2, whilst London Scottish Lions are currently 6th place in the same league on 21 points with the same win-loss ratio. Jersey, who are currently at the top of the league on 30 points, are unbeaten with 6 out of 6 wins. Only 2 points separate 2nd place from 6th place in the league. Hammersmith and Fulham are in 12th place, having lost all 6 games but picked up 4 bonus points along the way. In Counties 1 Essex Epping Upper Clapton are currently joint top of the table on 20 points having played 5 games and won 4. H.A.C. are sitting 4th place in Regional 2 Anglia on 21 points, having won 4 games and lost 2, and are 5 points behind league leaders Brentwood. Twickenham are currently sitting 9 th in Regional 2 South Central, with 15 points, having won 2 games and lost 4. There are 2 clear leaders in Winchester and Bournemouth, who have won all 6 of their opening games. Belsize Park are currently sitting top of Regional 2 Thames, on 26 points with 5 wins and a loss. Brunel are hot on their heels in 2nd place with 5 wins out of 5 and sitting on 25 points. Teddington in 5th place on 20 Points, Old Priorians in 6th place on 17 points and Grasshoppers in 9th place on 10 points. In Counties 1, Middlesex Old Streetonians are currently sitting unbeaten at the top of the table on 24 points, with 5 wins out of 5. followed closely by Finchley, Ealing Trailfinders 1871 & Old Haberdashers who are all sitting on 4 wins and 1 loss, followed by Chiswick, Hampstead, Ruislip, Saracens Amateurs, with both Wasps, & UCS sitting bottom of the league with 5 losses out of 5, In Counties 2 Middlesex, Barnet Elizabethans are joint top of the table with Actonians on 14 points having both won 3 and lost 1 game, Then the league is comprised of the following teams by league position Hackney, Enfield Ignatians, Harrow, Finsbury Park, Kilburn Cosmos and Old Millhillians in last place on 7 points with only 7 league points separating 1st place to last place, this looks like a very tight league and bonus points will have a large impact on the











overall league positions this season. All weekly league results can be found here

In respect of our Merit tables. We have 40 teams in 4 leagues, Premier and Division 1 have 9 teams each and Division 2 & 3 have 12 teams each. I tried to even out the leagues at the start of the season but asking clubs to step was a stretch too far for very valid reasons. We welcomed back Pinner & Hendon and are glad to be back in the fold. We have also seen newly formed 3rd teams from Chiswick, HAC, and London Scottish join the merit leagues. It is fair to say it has been our slowest start to Merit competition this season compared to the recent seasons. I am hearing from you, the clubs that players were slower to return after the summer, and general availability and appetite to play week in and week out are significant issues so far. Additionally, the start of the cup competition at the beginning of the season and the break for the Women's World Cup final have added an extra strain. I am hoping that as we go into November, this will pick up, but we are going into the Autumn International season, which always has a higher impact on Middlesex clubs. I do fear we will lose a couple of teams from the merit leagues before Christmas due to availability and player commitment.

- Div 2 Total 31 Games 20 Played, 4 postponed & 7 w/o - 64% Div 3 Total 31 Games - 21 Played (1 Game On) & 10 w/o - 67%
- Totals 94 Games 67 Played (2 Game On), 7 PostP,20 W/O's - 71.2%

Just focusing the commentary below on our Merit teams who are a single team club and how they are faring this season so far Premier merit table sees the top 5 places being held by lower 15 sides with New Zealand kiwis as our highest non-league team in 6th place with Quintin 1 place behind them in 7th place. Division 1 Merit table, West London in 2nd place on 19 points having won 2 and lost 2 and 2 points behind the league leaders with London Japanese in 3rd place Division 2 Merit table Pinner in top place on 32 points having won 4 and lost 2 games this season so far with Hendon in 9th place on 16 points, Haringey Rhinos in 11th place with 8 points and Whitton Lions at the footer of the league with 4 points. Division 3 Merit table Newly formed Ickenham & Uxbridge are currently top of the league on 37 points having played 6 games and won 5 followed by Hanwell in 7th on 20 points, Old Isleworthians in 8th place on 18th points and Northolt at the foot of the league on 7 points.

We have also been able to keep Middlesex Vets going and have 4 teams commit to a league, which was looking unlikely over the summer. We have lost a lot of Vets teams since COVID. So, thank you to Wasps FC, Hammersmith & Fulham, Grasshoppers and London Baa Baas (London Cornish, London Japanese, Esher & London Welsh) & Nigel Doe as organiser for keeping Vets Rugby alive in Middlesex. W/C 20th October the RFU are holding workshops to cover competitions and provide updates, I will summarise what was discussed in my next month's update but hopefully it won't be needed as you will all be there to hear it for yourselves.

Finally hold the date May 9th Middlesex 7's at Wasps FC.

Update from Chair of Team Middlesex - Mark Coles

I hope this finds you all well. Regarding Representative Rugby, whilst we are yet to get into the meat of the Age Grade games (more on later), we are seeing more of our age group teams assessments taking place.











Our Girls U16 Foundation (formerly the Girls ERDPP) is now into its fourth week post the assessments held with around 50 girls taking part in the programme, covering core skills and a classroom session on TREDS principles (Teamwork, Respect, Enjoyment, Discipline, and Sportsmanship).

Our U17's Boys assessments have been taking place last Friday (17th) with a strong number of player nominations from clubs for what we hope will be a competitive team and leaving the coaching team with a few hard decisions after we have seen all players. Having been down and seen what we are doing and some of the feedback we have had from parents it's a programme we can be proud of as the next cadre of players come into our teams. I did not do this much last season, but this season hope to put more of the feedback we get from parents/coaches/players in our newsletters to showcase the work going on. This week on the U17boys we received the below from one parent:

"Can I also compliment you on a very well-run assessment process. It was great to see a large number of (very competent) coaches - good coach to player ratio, coverage of a wide range of skills lineouts and scrums a particular favourite for me, the boys had a thorough workout across a number of competencies, and all achieved in a friendly environment. Parent comms also very insightful so we now understand the process."

Irrespective of outcome across any of our team, we give players as much individual feedback as possible so they can keep developing whether it be in the programme or back with their clubs and we may see next year. A big thanks to Jok Dunbar, Chris Grilli (U16G head coach) and Mark Gardiner (U17B Head Coach) and all their teams for bringing these sessions to life.



Our U18's Boys and Girls assessments are also happening towards the end of the month (26th October and 2nd November respectively) and again we will be blessed with strong numbers giving our coaching teams a 'nice problem' to have in assessing players moving up from the U17's Boys and U16 Girls cohorts, and new/returning talent coming in.

With first matches on late November and early December we're all looking forward to seeing the squads developing in the coming weeks.

On our Open Age programmes, work is going on in the background as to what these programmes will look like this year, and we hope to be advertising any coaching vacancies in near future on our social media channels/emails. Our U20 programme will













also shortly be shared with clubs as that kicks off early in the new year.

I also trailed last month our Vets offer is being brought back this season and we hope to be able to put games on for both genders. So far, we have a male SuperVets (50+) game against Hertfordshire lined up for the 29th November (at Wasps FC) and male Vets (35+) game lined up against the RAF on 21st January (location-TBD). We are hoping to be able to advertise for female players for a London and Herts combined side (very TBC) ahead of a first ever solely Middlesex female Vets game at the end of the season. Emails and social media posts to clubs will be going out to collect interest and explain more so we can field full sides.

Next month, I'm hoping to update on the progress we will have made on the above appointments/ideas, and share more on the assessments and games we have coming up but for now thanks as ever for reading and for your support

A call to action from Discipline

The County is looking to recruit panellists to join the current Discipline team.

More panellists means we can share the load. Panel hearings are either in person or on-line. New panellists can bring their experiences in the game to help an established panel chair to decide on outcomes following discipline incidents (red cards & citings). We ask clubs to encourage their members (players, explayers, officials etc.) to consider this opportunity to support the game in Middlesex. Initially volunteers are asked to observe a hearing to get a feel of the role. Panellists would then be eligible to











join the rota so they can manage their commitment.

The county is also looking for an Assistant Discipline Secretary to assist the current Discipline Secretary manage hearings and support panels ahead of hearings. The role will need organisational and IT skills. Knowledge of the processes involved can be quickly picked up while working alongside the current Discipline Secretary.
